We competed our first course this past weekend on Nonprofit Management for the church. Congratulations to the 60 early adopters in our diocese who are part of this unique innovative program!

The first course was on managing our most valuable assets: Volunteers in Ministry. The training session provided tools for developing job

descriptions, recruiting/hiring, orienting, training, and evaluating and coaching the performance of employees and volunteers. Special emphasis was placed on communication, motivation and recognizing volunteer and employee efforts including appreciation and celebration.

New Sacred Ground Circle Forming

The Commission for Intercultural Ministry is forming a Sacred Ground Dialogue Circle that will begin meeting on **December 1, 2020**. Sacred Ground is a 10-session study of the history of race in the United States, and the relationship between anti-racism work and faith.

This course is a transformative opportunity to learn more about the history of various racial groups in our country, to reflect upon your own relationship to race, and to prayerfully consider God's call to you to continue learning, acting, and reflecting in the future.
