



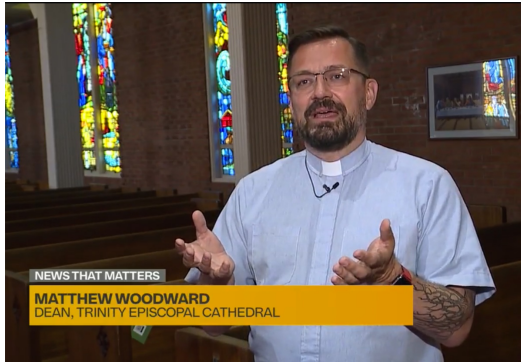

Trinity Cathedral Pride Flag Burned

On Saturday, June 5, Trinity Cathedral Dean Matthew Woodward received a call from a parishioner that the Pride flag was missing from the front of the church. He looked around the property, and discovered the flag had been torn down and burned nearby. Remains of the flag were blessed during the Sunday Eucharist. Police are investigating the crime. 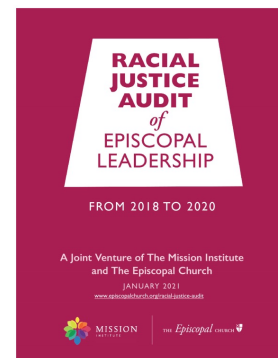

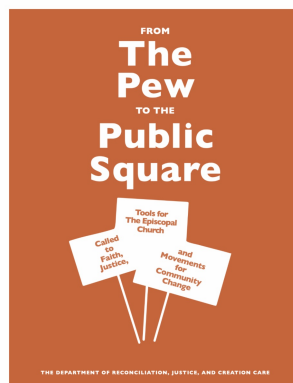
