St. John's Chico Hosts Camp Fire Disaster Case Managers at Celebration

The unsung heroes of the Camp Fire recovery are the Disaster Case Managers (DCMs) who engage with the thousands of survivors who need considerable assistance in finding the resources to begin to rebuild their lives after the Camp Fire of November 8, 2018. DCMs help survivors navigate the the various agencies, both public and private, that can fill the gap between their resources on hand and the amount needed to return to a life similar to that before the Fire. Up to 50% of Camp Fire survivors need this assistance. DCMs also are then advocates to the official Unmet Needs Roundtable of the Long Term Recovery Group that brings agencies and organizations together to fill the gap. (St. John's is a member of the Unmet Needs Roundtable and is represented by Sherry Wallmark. Through the generosity of the Diocese of Northern California and the Episcopal Church we have been able to give thousands of dollars to these families.)

DCMs have also been subject to significant secondary trauma as well as moral injury, listening day in and day out to stories of trauma, but also experiencing their powerlessness in not being able to always meet all the needs that are presented to them. DCMs are understaffed and overworked, and are subject to considerable attrition.

The Spiritual and Emotional Wellness Committee (SEW) of the Camp Fire Collaborative, where Richard Yale of St. John's serves on the leadership team, recognized that our DCMs needed support and care. Knowing from our work throughout the recovery that resilience is built upon community cohesion and



celebration, SEW threw a DCM Appreciation Event at St. John's Chico on October 29th. The festive event was attended by over 50 people, including community leaders from the Camp Fire recovery effort. Sherry Wallmark and Richard Yale served as hosts from St. John's. The event happened during paid work hours, so that the DCMs would not lose income or have to use personal time for the event. 
What to Know

- Go to the options bar on your video screen and select Reactions > Raise Hand.
- To lower your hand, select Reactions > Lower Hand.
- You need Zoom version 5.4.7 or later to do this.

This article includes instructions on raising (and lowering) your hand during a Zoom call using Zoom version 5.4.7 or later on a laptop or desktop computer.

How to Raise Your Hand

1. During a meeting, navigate to the bottom options bar in your video screen and click Reactions.

How-To Guide: Making sure your Zoom app is Up to Date

In order to fully participate in the 2021 Diocesan Convention, you will need the latest version of the Zoom app on your device.

The latest version of Zoom has new features such as the "raise hand" icon and quick "yes/no" voting buttons. These non-verbal communication tools are vital to participating as a voting member of Convention through the Zoom platform.

If your desktop computer is incompatible with the newest version of Zoom, try logging in with your mobile device (smartphone or tablet) instead. If you don't have access to a compatible device or a reliable internet connection, you can call the Office of the Bishop to phone in your votes manually.
