

**Canon Tim Naish of Canterbury
To Preach at Emmanuel's 170th Celebration**

The Rev. Dr. Timothy Naish, newly retired canon from Canterbury Cathedral in England, will preach at Emmanuel Episcopal Church's 170th anniversary on Sunday, August 17, at 8 and 10 a.m.

Canon Tim and Hilary Naish will be special guests also at a celebratory brunch the day before, on Saturday, August 16 at 11 am. The community is invited.

Canon Tim was involved with mission in India, Zaire, Uganda and England and was ordained in the Anglican Church of the Congo in 1987. He and Hilary raised three children.



Canon Tim served as a parish priest in Oxfordshire before teaching at Ripon College Cuddesdon, a seminary near Oxford. He prepared men and women for ordained ministry, led the non-residential program, and taught the theology and practice of mission.

In 2018 he became Canon Librarian at Canterbury Cathedral, joining a team of four of residentiary canons and the "chapter" – the cathedral's governing body. He served seven years at the mother church of the worldwide Anglican Communion, which includes the Episcopal Church of America.

At Canterbury Cathedral, established in 597, he had responsibility for running annual programs for newly appointed bishops and newly ordained clergy from across the world.

At Canterbury, Canon Tim greeted pilgrims from everywhere. Father Seth met Tim when he and his family stayed in Canterbury during his 2022 sabbatical.
