

To calculate the number of live viewers on **Facebook**, you can use the Peak Concurrent Viewers metric, which is available in Creator Studio and Page Insights:

1. Go to Creator Studio or Page Insights
2. Click on the live video you want to see metrics for
3. Find the Live Broadcast Audience in a new tab
4. Click the tab to see the Viewers During Live Broadcast interactive chart

To calculate live viewers on **Zoom**, you can access the "Participants" panel during a meeting to see the current number of attendees actively joined, which represents your live viewers at that moment; for more detailed information after the meeting, you can check your Zoom account's reports to view the unique attendee count for a specific meeting.

Key points about checking live viewers on Zoom:

- **During a meeting:**

Open the "Participants" panel within the Zoom interface to see the live attendee count.

- **After a meeting:**
 - **Access Zoom reports:** Log into your Zoom account, navigate to the "Reports" section, and select "Usage" to view details about participants in a specific meeting.
 - **Check for unique attendees:** When analyzing reports, ensure you select the option to view "unique users" to get an accurate count of individual participants.

To calculate live viewers on **YouTube**, go to your YouTube Studio, navigate to the "Analytics" tab, then select the "Live" section where you can see the "Concurrent viewers" report, which shows the number of people watching your live stream at any given time; you can access this data while streaming or after the live stream ends.

Key points:

- **Access through YouTube Studio:** You need to access your YouTube Studio to view live stream analytics.
 - **"Concurrent viewers" metric:** The key metric to see how many people are watching live is the "Concurrent viewers" report.
 - **Real-time and post-stream access:** You can view live viewer counts while streaming or after the stream has ended.

To calculate live viewers on **Twitch**, simply look at the viewer count displayed directly on your stream, which shows the number of people actively watching your live video at that moment; you can find this number in red below the video player on the Twitch platform.

Key points about Twitch viewer count:

- **Real-time update:** The viewer count updates live as people join and leave your stream.
- **Accessible on stream:** You can see the live viewer count directly on your Twitch stream without needing to access any additional analytics.
- **Includes all viewers:** This number includes anyone watching your live video, regardless of whether they are logged in or have a Twitch account.
